

2024 ICOM Solidarity Project: Community-Led Training: Establishing a Foundation for Heritage Conservation in Africa

PROJECT DURATION: July 2024 - December 2024

OBJECTIVE: This six-month initiative aims to enhance the management of collections in Africa by focusing on three key topics: **Conservation**, **Risk Assessment**, and **Documentation**. The programme will bring together a large consortium of ICOM Committees and members to provide an African perspective on these crucial areas through interviews and round table discussions. Our goal is to strengthen the network between African and global museum professionals. Sessions will be interactive and participants will be asked to complete assignments relating to the discussion topic. The completed assignments will be discussed at subsequent meetings and outcomes will be used to create toolkit guides and videos on each of the three topics.

FORMAT

- **Interviews**: Invited experts will outline current practices and approaches on all three topics. These will be conducted in English and released before each live session for asynchronous viewing before each session.

Round Table Discussions: For each topic, our invited speakers will lead two round table discussions.

First Round Table: Topic Discussion. Participants receive assignments to complete and video their outputs.

Second Round Table: Network enhancement. Presentation and discussion of the video outputs.

- **Produced Materials**: All content, including interviews and discussions, will be compiled into toolkits and how-to videos for broad dissemination.

PROGRAMME HIGHLIGHTS

Programming will be in English with simultaneous interpretation by Smartidom (PT) into French and Portuguese.
